CHOOSING A BAT (2 Alternate Concepts)

1. By Age and Bat Length:

<i>Pee Wees (5-6) & Lions (7):</i>	<i>24" - 27"</i>
<i>Pony (8)</i>	<i>27" - 29"</i>
<i>Cubs (9-10) & Mustang (8-10)</i>	<i>27" - 30"</i>
<i>Bantam & Broncos (11-12)</i>	<i>28" - 30"</i>
<i>Grasshopper, Freshmen & Colts</i>	<i>29" - 32"</i>

You determine the proper weight by seeing if you players can hold the bat out parallel to the ground for 20 seconds. The lighter the better, especially since they are metal.
